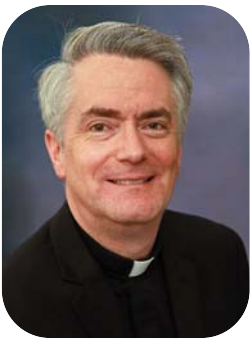

Anthony F. Bittar spent the last ten years serving in the United States Army - both on active duty and with the Colorado Army National Guard. His most recent assignment was at the American Embassy in Amman, Jordan, where he served as the Joint-Action Officer for multinational military exercises.

Baldemar M. Garza



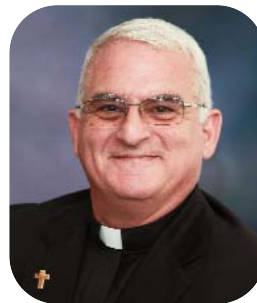
Baldemar M. Garza is originally from Corpus Christi, TX. He graduated from California State University, Long Beach.

The newly-renovated "Alumni Chapel" - the heart of our community

Our alumni have donated to honor their memories of their formation at Blessed John XXIII, or to remember friends or family members. The Alumni Chapel will be dedicated during this year's Alumni Days event by the former Seminary Rector, Bishop Peter J. Uglietto. Alumni Days take place October 16-17, 2012.

We are pleased to have started the first phase of our capital campaign: *The Pathway to the Future*, over the summer academic break.

The attendees at this year's Lawn Party were among the first to view these renovations. They were met with an enlarged entranceway offering improved access, which is compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act. There is also more visible signage and a newly-decorated Seminary foyer.

Perhaps the most significant change is our newly-

renovated "Alumni Chapel" - with improved lighting, upholstered pews for comfort, and more accessibility and capacity, including unobstructed balcony seating.

The Chapel will be named in honor of our many alumni supporters who have gene-

Perhaps the most comprehensive modification goes unseen: the installation throughout the building of a fire-protection system with new alarms and a sprinkler system. These projects represent the completion of the first phase of our capital campaign.
